



# how to care for vintage glassware

## do's

- hand wash in lukewarm water
- use gentle dishsoap
- dry immediatly with soft cloth
- use baking soda for tough spots
- store with protective padding



## fun fact!

has been around  
since 1915!

## storage

- use plate stands for display pieces
- wrap in soft cloth for long-term storage
- store at room temperature
- place padding between stacked plates
- store away from heavy foot traffic
- use cabinet/shelf liners for protection

## dont's

- no dishwasher (unless noted)
- no extreme temperatures
- no stacking
- no harsh chemicals
- no microwave (unless noted)

## cleaning

- water spots - white vinegar/lemon juice
- mineral deposits - lemon juice & salt
- fingerprints - microfiber cloth
- soap residue - distilled water
- hard water buildup - vinegar soak

## when to retire

- deep chips along rim → RETIRE
- cracks through glass → RETIRE
- loose stems/handles → RETIRE
- cloudy areas in glass → RETIRE
- star cracks from impact → RETIRE
